

2026 EYSA T-BALL RULES & REGULATIONS

4U (Micro) / 6U (PeeWee)

EYSA follows the general guidelines provided by T-Ball USA, except for the following modifications.

1. RULES

- a. There are no protests in the EYSA t-ball program.
- b. Scores, wins, and losses will not be kept.
- c. T-balls will be used.
- d. Helmets must be worn by all batters and baserunners.
- e. No metal cleats are permitted.
- f. Coaches, parents, or spectators may be used as umpires.
- g. Jewelry/taped jewelry is not permitted.
- h. All parents/guardians must complete an Emergency Medical Authorization form (EMA) for each participant in the game.
- i. No special playing field is required.
- j. The home team will provide the tee, game balls, and bases.
- k. Rules of play will be enforced with leniency.
- l. An inning ends when the entire batting order has batted through.
- m. Batters do not strike out.
- n. No dented, cracked, or damaged bats.
- o. Distance between bases will be 40-feet.
- p. The ball must be hit more than 10 feet to be live.
- q. Players who throw the bat may be issued a warning or called out. Thrown bats that strike any player, coach, or game official – regardless of the team the struck player is on – shall be called out without warning.
- r. Games will last no longer than 1 hour. There is a 10-minute grace period for teams to meet the minimum roster size of 6 players.
- s. Players must wear the issued EYSA jersey as the outer-most garment that is reflective of the team on which they are rostered. A garment of like-color may be used in the event of a missing jersey.
- t. Rainouts will be determined by the Director of Fields and Courts up to 2-hours before the scheduled game time. The Director of Coaches will notify team coaches of rainouts. Team coaches will notify their team. Coaches are responsible for advising their team of the rainout status.
